General Conditions

- 1) The Permit shall be considered valid for a period of one year from the date of approval. If construction has not begun within the valid term of the Permit, a new Permit will need to be secured.
- 2) All commercial and industrial access requests must be submitted with sufficient construction drawings/plans to the Vanderburgh County Engineering Department.
- 3) If the access radius extends in front of an adjoining property, the Petitioner must exhibit proof of the adjoining property owner's permission prior to the approval of the Permit.
- 4) The minimum amount of cover over any culvert within the public right-of-way shall be twelve (12) inches. Any cover amount less than twelve (12) inches shall be verified by the culvert manufacturer's recommendations prior to approval. The Petitioner shall provide all requested verification.
- 5) All materials shall be as specified on page 1 of this Permit.
- The Petitioner may elect to have their culvert (if required) installed by the Vanderburgh County Highway Department (VCHD). All work done by the VCHD is free of charge. However, the work may be scheduled only after a Permit has been issued and must be done so by the Petitioner with VCHD at the convenience of the VCHD. All culvert materials shall be provided by the Petitioner.
- 7) Any work not performed by the VCHD shall be done at the Petitioner's expense and is subject to final approval by the Vanderburgh County Engineer or his representative.
