He holds a B.A. Degree in Sociology and a Master's Degree in Urban and Regional Planning. He was a member of the Fannie Mae Housing Impact Advisory Council and the National Fair Housing Alliance Board of Directors. He has been a member of the national community development division and state of Louisiana American Planning Associations.
