

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VANDERBURGH COUNTY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING A BOND ISSUE TO MAKE PERMANENT REPAIRS AND ERECT ADDITIONAL BUILDINGS TO THE BOEHNE TUBERCULOSIS HOSPITAL OF VANDERBURGH COUNTY, INDIANA.

Vanderburgh, State of Indiana, by proper and legal order, on the

4th day of February, 1924, created and established a County Tuberand Africally Action and the name of the Carlot and Africally Action and accepted a deed from the Board of Trustees of
the Vanderburgh Anti-Tuberculosis Society to Boehne Camp, comprising
approximately forty-five (45) acres of land, with its appurtenant
buildings, cattle, furniture and other equipment, on the condition
and consideration that it be maintained and supported as a County
institution on behalf of Vanderburgh County, State of Indiana, and,

whereas, the revenue arising and available from taxation and the County funds of said Vanderburgh County, State of Indiana, are insufficient to make said repairs and additions to said Vanderburgh County Tuberculosis Hospital, and,

WHEREAS, certain buildings are in urgent need of immediate repairs and there is great danger of fire hazards, and a need of additional buildings and equipment to care for the health of the citizens of said Vanderburgh County, Indiana, who are afflicted and suffering from tuberculosis, and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Vanderburgh County, State of Indiana, have appointed duly qualified and licensed architects and engineers to draw plans and specifications for the needed repairs and additions to said Vanderburgh County Tuberculosis Hospital, and make the necessary estimates thereon and which plans, specifications and estimates are now finished, and on file with the

Auditor of Vanderburgh County, Indiana, and,

whereas, the law provides that the Board of Commissioners of Vanderburgh County with the approval of the County Council shall have the power to borrow money for the repair and erection of additions to said Vanderburgh County Tuberculosis Hospital, on the credit of the County and issue County obligations therefor, in such manner as it may do for other County purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Vanderburgh County Council of the County of Vanderburgh in the State of Indiana that in order to repair the present buildings and erect the necessary additions to said Vanderburgh County Tuberculosis Hospital as set out in the plans, specifications and estimates provided by duly appointed architects and on file with the Auditor of said Vanderburgh County, that the Board of Commissioners of said Vanderburgh County, in the State of Indiana, be and the said Board is hereby authorized and directed to issue bonds of the County of Vanderburgh, State of Indiana, in the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) as follows: Three Hundred (300) bonds in the denomination of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), said bonds to be numbered from One (1) to Three Hundred (300) both inclusive, each bond to be dated november 11/6 1924, and to bear interest at the rate of Four and One-half $(4\frac{1}{2})$ per centum per annum payable semiannually on February 1st, of each year during the term for which each of said bonds shall run. ORDINANCE OF THE VANDERBURGH COUNTY COUNCIL OF VANDERBURGH COUNTY, INDIANA.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Vanderburgh County, Indiana by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, entitled "An act authorizing counties in which are located cities of the second class to erect and maintain memorial build ngs, auditoriums, and coliseums, in cooperation with private associations and corporations" approved March 15, 1913, on the 5th day of May, 1913, adopted a declaratory resolution declaring in favor of joining with the Vanderburgh County Memorial Coliseum Corporation in the erection and maintenance of a memorial coliseum building, at an aggregate cost of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars, (\$150,000.00) one-third of which to be contributed by said corporation, and the remaining two-thirds to-wit: One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) to be contributed by said County of Vanderburgh; and

WHEREAS, purSuant to the provisions of said Act, the qualified voters of said Vanderburgh County, at an election held for that purpose on the 31st day of May, 1913, ratified said declaratory resolution; and

WHEREAS, certain proceedings have been had pursuant to the provisions of said Act in the condemnation and acquisition of a site upon which to erect said proposed memorial coliseum building; and

Memorial
WHEREAS, the said Vanderburgh County/Coliseum Corporation has complied with the requirements of said declaratory resolution, as well as the provisions of said Act, by having paid to the
Treasurer of the Board of Coliseum Directors the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars, (\$50,000.00) so
that it now becomes necessary for the County of Vanderburgh to provide for the payment of its o ne
Hundred Thousand Dollars, (\$100,000.00) as by said declaratory resolution agreed to; and

WHEREAS, there are not sufficient funds in the treasury of Vanderburgh County to meet said obligation, and the only method for obtaining said funds being by an issue and sale of county bonds; and

WHEREAS, express provision is made in said Act for the issue of bonds to raise the necessary funds to make such payment.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Vanderburgh County Council, of Vanderburgh County, Indiana, that the sum of One Hundred thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of paying the county's portion of the obligation assumed by the declaratory resolution above referred, to for the purpose of erecting the Memorial Coliseum Building, in the Coty of Evansville, in Vanderburgh County, State of Indiana as authorized by the Act of the General Assembly for the year 1913 as aforesaid.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Vanderburgh County Council of Vanderburgh County, Indiana, and the Auditor of Vanderburgh County, Indiana, are hereby authorized to issue and sell bonds of the County of Vanderburgh, State of Indiana, in the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) as follows: One hundred bonds each in the sum and denomination of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00); said bonds to be numbered from one (I) to one hundred (100) inclusive and to be payable twenty years after date. Said bonds to be dated November 15, 1915 and to bear interest at the rate of 4% per annum payable semi-annually, on November 15th and May 15th of each year during said term. Interest and principal payable at the City National Bank, Evansville, Indiana.

BE II FURTHER ORDAINED that said bonds shall state the purpose for which the same are issued, and shall be executed by the said Board of Commissioners, signing the same, and the Auditor attesting the same, under the seal of said Board of Commissioners, and they shall be executed and sold in all respects in accordance with the laws of the State of Indiana. Coupons shall represent the semi-annual interest payments, and the signatures of the Board of Commissioners, and the Auditor, may be lithographed thereon.

March 8, 1923.

To The Honorable County Council Evansville, Indiana.

Gentlemen:

The Good Roads Bureau of the Evansville Chamber of Commerce have given careful thought to the road work of Vanderburgh County. Knowing the cooperation you have always shown, we are presuming on your friendship to make the following suggestions.

We realize that under the new law, one ans one-half million dollars will be our bonded limit. Present projects give us nearly a million dollars. That leaves only one-half million for development. When we are up to this limit, the interest alone on these bonds will be \$75,000.00. These are twenty year bonds, so this means an additional \$75,000.00 for retiring the bonds. Tax-payers must pay \$150,000.00 per year without a penny for maintenance or construction.

Our committee wishes to recommend that for the year 1923, in addition to the projects now under way, that you take only the improvement of the Boonville and New Harmony roafs, from Darmstadt west to the Big Cynthiana Road. This is to be a rock road with an asphalt binder.

For the year 1924 we auggest only two roads. One, the Big Cynthiana road, from the present terminus of concrete, to the Posey County line. The other, the Petersburg road, from the Dixie Bee crossing at Erskine Station, to the Wheeler Bridge, or what is known as the Base Line Road. These two roads are to be hard surfaced.

we thank you for the cooperation you have shown and solicit continuation of the pleasant spirit.

An ordinance levying Taxes for the purpose of raising revenues for the County Fund, Interest and Sinking Fund, Gravel Road Repair Fund of the Treasury of Vanderburgh County.

STATE OF INDIANA, VANDERBURGH COUNTY.

SECTION I. Be it ordained by the VANDERBURGH COUNTY COUNCIL OF INDIANA: That there shall be in the year 1924 assessed and collected the sum of thirty-three (33) cents upon each one hundred dollars' worth of taxable property, and fifty (50) cents upon each taxable poll in the County, which money when collected shall be paid into the "COUNTY FUND" of the COUNTY TREASURY.

WHEREAS, CERTAIN BUILDINGS ARE IN URGENT NEED OF IMMEDIATE REPAIRS AND THERE IS GREAT DANGER OF FIRE HAZARDS, AND THERE IS ALSO NEED OF A NEW CENTRAL HEATING PLANT TO HEAT THE PRESENT BUILDINGS AND A NEED OF ADDITIONAL BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT TO CARE FOR THE HEALTH OF THE CITIZENS OF SAID VANDERBURGH COUNTY, INDIANA, WHO ARE AFFLICTED AND SUFFERING FROM TUBERCULOSIS, AND

WHEREAS, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF VANDERBURGH COUNTY, STATE OF INDIANA, HAVE APPOINTED DULY QUALIFIED AND LICENSED ARCHITECTS AND ENGINEERS TO DRAW PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE NEEDED REPAIRS AND ADDITIONS TO SAID VANDERBURGH COUNTY TUBERCULOSIS HOSPITAL AND MAKE THE NECESSARY ESTIMATES THEREON AND WHICH PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS AND ESTIMATES ARE NOW FINISHED, AND ON FILE WITH THE AUDITOR OF VANDERBURGH COUNTY, INDIANA, AND
