You'll see some designs as a jumping off point based on design guidelines and geographical constraints. The design isn't completely set in stone, and this is why we are meeting with the public to see what needs to be done to make this project good.

- VOICE
 - Community-wide, citizen-driven planning
 - Process to create vision for preferred future
- Connectivity
 - o All modes of transportation
 - Green spaces, easy transit
- Walnut has it all
- Road Diet
 - Simple concept
 - o The road has four lanes; this would narrow it to three lanes
 - East bound
 - West bound
 - 2-way left turn movement
 - So, why?
 - Provides a "complete street"
 - Multiple modes of transportation
 - Pedestrians
 - o Cars
 - Cyclists



- Walking/Running
- Safer for all modes
- Minimize impacts to adjacent property owners
- Trying to accomplish the goal of looking different but not necessarily bigger
- The city does this without digging into the coffers
 - NO CITY BUDGET MONEY IS BEING USED FOR THIS IMPROVEMENT PROJECT
 - Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)/Indiana Dept of Transportation (INDOT) federal funding
 - o 80% Federal
 - o 20% Local Match
 - Regional Cities dollars
 - EWSU Green Infrastructure Incentive Program
 - Current under consent decree
 - The blessing on this difficult circumstance is that the dollars that have to go into alternative treatments can be utilized on this project; money has to be spent regardless, so this provides part of the match
 - Two other organizations wanted to help with this project as part of community health and wellness
 - Vectren
 - Welborn Baptist Foundation.

Project Manager – Dwayne Sanders, Project Manager - Lochmueller Group

Additional information – VS Engineering will be managing the project to deliver on-time and within budget. Nick Jahn, PE from VS Engineering is the deputy project manager. VS will also be responsible for a portion of the design. Would really appreciate community feedback; feedback is critical to the development of the project. Says there has never been a project he's been involved with that has required as much feedback from residents as this project.

Phasing

- Currently in the conception stage
- Real specifics will be coming in the months ahead
- Project is divided into three phases
 - 1. US Hwy 41 to Weinbach Avenue
 - 2. Weinbach Avenue to Vann Avenue
 - 3. MLK Jr Blvd to US Hwy 41
- Divided into these phases based on specifics of the areas each is in
 - Phase 1- 80-ft public right-of-way in some areas will allow greater design flexibility
 - Phase 2- Public right-of-way decreases to 60-ft
 - Phase 3- Majority of the notable historic structures are located here
 - Also some additional environmental concerns in this area due to things underground or in some structures
 - Perfect world would put Phases 1 & 2 together, but this is all dependent on funding
- North side 10-ft multi-use trail + 5-foot green space (minimum size)
- South side Sidewalk (might have green space too, in Phase 1 area); for most part sidewalk will be along curb
- Lighting will be installed (<u>click to see "Typical section" slide</u>)

- Phase 1 Project Development (US Hwy 41 to Weinbach Avenue)
 - Preliminary Plans Technical Review Aug 2018
 - Final Plans Technical Review Oct 2019
 - Bid Date (Letting date for contract) Jan 2020
- Phase 2 Project Development (MLK Jr Blvd to US Hwy 41 and Weinbach Avenue to Vann Avenue)
 - Preliminary Plans Jan 2019
 - o Final Plans June 2020
 - Letting Oct 2020

Goals

- Walking/Health/Wellness
- Multi-use trail connections to existing facilities
 - State Hospital grounds (and pedestrian bridge)
 - Access to soccer fields
 - Access to baseball fields
 - Future access to Roberts Park after its development



- Hi-Rail Trail
- University of Evansville
 - More connectivity
 - Working with senior classes as a project
 - More engagement with the community (UE \rightarrow EVPL Central Library downtown)
- MLK Jr Blvd/Walnut Street Intersection
 - EVPL Central Library and Ford Center and DoubleTree Hotel and Old National Events Plaza
 - MLK Jr Blvd to Heidelbach Avenue (proposed learning garden)
 - More of an urbanized trail
 - Landscape pavers/decorations
 - Green infrastructure
 - Rain gardens (example)
 - Different features
 - Green infrastructure
 - Storm water detention basins (underground) up to the Kentucky Avenue area from MLK Jr Blvd/Walnut Street intersection
- IU Medical School/I-Light Connection
 - I-Light fiber connection
 - If needed, elements for this will be introduced
 - Ex: underground conduit to be used in the future for fiber
 - Would be a good connection to share between:
 - UE----Stone Family Center for Health Education----USI
- METS Comprehensive Operations Analysis
 - Where should bus shelters go?
 - What should they look like?
 - Should any be moved or eliminated?
