Message from the Director of Promise Zone

Greetings,

In 2016 Evansville was successful in achieving one of the last Promise Zone designation, which has been actively bringing new poverty fighting opportunities in the urban core of Evansville. The Zone area encompasses roughly 2/5ths of the city's geography and a population within it of nearly 39% of whom live below the poverty level. The Promise Zone designation allows access to 16 federal agencies in competitive grant situations in addition to increasing competitiveness for funding applications from Evansville. Promise Zone consists of 7 Working Groups: Crime, Job Development, Education, Health, Housing, Economic Development, and Community Engagement.

I am very excited about the Promise Zone at a time when we are planning for 2018-2019. This year is going to be big for the Promise Zone residents and the Promise Zone itself. I encourage everyone to check out our social media just search "Evansville Promise" on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. What matters most is that we serve you better by keeping you up to date and engaged with what is happening with the Promise Zone. We are actively working on new designs for the website to help you connect quickly and easily. I recognize and appreciate that this Promise Zone is a resident driven process and I encourage you to take part and have your voice be heard within our community engagement group. Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program (HVRP)

Located at the Gresham House overlooking Garvin Park, HVRP works with homeless veterans to get them back on their feet. The program can house up to 6 veterans at a time for up to 60 days. The veterans are provided with housing and job assistance through the



HVRP team, and clothing and food from donors. Lately they have seen two exciting success stories.

First, a young veteran who had been homeless, and living at the local mission came to HVRP for housing and job placement assistance. He was living at Gresham House when an out of state job training program became available. The HVRP team helped him with donor provided clothing and food that allowed him to successfully complete his training program, and then enter into a full time position.

A second recent success story was a veteran who had been living with a family member and suffering with alcoholism. The HVRP team set him up with housing at Gresham house and got him through a drug treatment program. Thanks to his hard work and the aid of HVRP, this veteran was able to land a job at a local university.














Pilot program to Mentor High School students so they can reach their highest potential! Eight Saturdays, 9am to 12pm September 22 to Nov 10th
