### West Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements

Over the next 24 years, EWSU will spend \$729 million for **Renew Evansville**, the federally mandated integrated overflow control plan, which will be the largest infrastructure project in the city's history. The plan includes a **6.1 million gallon combination sewage overflow (CSO)** basin at the West Wastewater Treatment Plant, a new screening diversion structure, and a new plant entrance. The CSO storage basin will handle excess water during heavy

storm events to **dramatically reduce** 

combination rainwater and sewage

discharges into the Ohio River.





## CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL & RECYCLING

EWSU will offer the annual **Christmas tree disposal** service starting Monday, **December 28, through Friday, January 15, 2021**.

Republic Services will pick up Christmas trees on the same day as the regular trash service for three weeks. Trees should be placed next to the trash cart. The service is for city residents only who pay for their trash and recycling with their monthly water and sewer bill. It is not available to apartment complexes, mobile home communities or retail/commercial businesses.

The Vanderburgh County Solid Waste District will accept live Christmas trees at the annual Christmas tree recycling drop-off event on **Saturday**, **January 9, 2021**, from 8 a.m. until noon at the old Walmart west parking lot on University Drive. Trees will be



## 2021 Water and Sewer Rates

Due to the financial burden caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, Evansville Water and Sewer Utility will not increase sewer rates in 2021 as originally called for in the US-EPA-mandated integrated overflow control plan. Water rates will increase by 6% effective January 1, 2021, as part of a three-year, phased-in rate increase approved by the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission in 2018.
