### **Vanderburgh County Commissioners Announce Free Storm Debris Disposal to be Offered at Burdette Park**

EVANSVILLE, IN – April 5, 2024 – In the wake of the recent storm that has impacted Vanderburgh County, the Vanderburgh County Commissioners, Vanderburgh County Highway Department, and Burdette Park are joining hands to assist Vanderburgh County residents by offering a natural storm debris dumping site at Burdette Park.

Starting Tuesday, April 9<sup>th</sup>, residents of Vanderburgh County are invited to utilize the designated drop-off point located at the front baseball field, located directly opposite the main entrance of Burdette Park. This service is offered at no cost to Vanderburgh County residents affected by the storm. These services are solely for residential use and not intended for commercial purposes. Please note that only natural storm debris such as tree limbs will be accepted; no other materials, including roofing shingles or house siding, will be permitted for disposal.

#### **Event Information:**

**What:** Free Natural Storm Debris Disposal for Vanderburgh County Residents

**Dates:** April 9<sup>th</sup> – April 20<sup>th</sup> (excluding Sunday, April 14<sup>th</sup>) or until debris field is full

**Hours:** 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. CST daily (site will be securely locked outside of these hours)

**Location:** Front baseball field across from Burdette Park's main entrance at 5301 Nurrenbern Rd., Evansville IN 47712

**Accepted Materials:** Natural storm debris ONLY

**Eligibility:** Vanderburgh County residents ONLY (driver's license or identification card required)

**Support:** Vanderburgh County Highway Department will be on site to direct residents and verify eligibility. Residents are responsible for unloading their own debris.
